1. Authority

- The event will be a Club Super Sprint held under the International Sporting Code of the F.I.A., the National Competition Rules (NCR) of the Confederation of Australian Motor Sport Ltd. (CAMS), the Speed Event Standing Regulations, the CAMS Passenger in Vehicle Guidelines, the 2017 P.C.V. Standing Competition Regulations, these Supplementary Regulations, and any Further Regulations which may be issued. The event will be conducted under and in accordance with the CAMS OH&S and Risk Management Policies, which can be found at www.cams.com.au
- The event will be a multi car super sprint conducted at Phillip Island Grand Prix Circuit over 4.45km in an anti-clockwise direction.

2. Entries

- Online entry is available via the club website. Entries open on publication of these Regulations, close 9pm Monday 18th September, with late entry fee thereafter.
- In accordance with NCR 83 of the current CAMS Manual of Motor Sport, the PCV competition committee reserves the right to refuse an entry without explanation.
- A maximum of 120 entries will be accepted and in order of receipt.
- Entry fees are as stated on the club website.
- All competitors must have registered to get their Cars scrutineered by 08.30 hrs on the day of the sprint.
- Entry to the event is conditional upon assisting during the day as and when requested by the organisers
- Competitors must produce their current club membership card and current CAMS L2S/L2SJ licence (or superior), CAMS Vehicle Log book (if issued) and Competition Record (if issued) at registration.

3. Vehicles/Scrutiny

- Cars presented to the scrutineer not ready for competition will be denied entry. CAMS Log books (if issued) must be presented at scrutiny.
- All loose objects must be removed from vehicles.
- Cars must comply with Schedules A and B of the current CAMS Manual of Motor Sport & P.C.V. 2017 Competition Rules.
- GT, A, B, C & D Class cars tyres must be roadworthy and comply with Schedule E of the current CAMS Manual of Motor Sport & the P.C.V. 2017 Competition Rules.
- Open, Cup & M Class cars must comply with the current CAMS Manual of Motor Sport, Schedule E - Wheel and Tyres, Clause 3 - Wet Weather Tyres.
- Competition cars may be selected for Dyno and/or Weight testing and/or Eligibility assessment under the 2017 PCV standing rules.
- Competition cars must be fitted with a Dorian transponder, as timing will be by electronic means only. Competitors in Entrée Class only will not be timed and Dorians are not required.
- Note: Maximum Noise not to exceed 95db(A) as measured by 30-Metre drive by test on equipment provided by circuit.

4. Apparel

- Open, Cup, & M Class competitors must wear driving suits in accordance with the current CAMS Manual of Motor Sport, Schedule D. All other competitors must wear neck to ankle to wrist non-flammable clothing.
- Seatbelts must be fitted to the vehicle and must comply with Current Australian Standards and Schedule I of the current CAMS Manual of Motor Sport.
- Helmets must carry a standard as listed in Schedule D of the current CAMS Manual of Motor Sport.

5. Event

- Cars will be released onto the circuit sequentially at 2-10 second intervals. Vehicles must run in allocated Group order. A maximum of 26 cars will be permitted on the circuit at any one time.
- Drivers are not to refuel in pit lane, starting or dummy grids
- Drivers must obey flag and board signals. The Facts to be Judged shall be in accordance with the Speed Event Standing Regulations.
- Protests, if any, must be submitted in writing to the Stewards or Clerk of Course in accordance with Part XII of the current NCR.
- Results posted on the day are provisional only. Awards for the event will be as per the 2017 PCV Standing Competition Rules.
- Passengers will not be permitted in vehicles during any part of the Supersprint.
- This event will include a Motor Sport Passenger Ride Activity (MSPRA) which shall be run under and in accordance with the CAMS MSPRA Policy and the PCV developed processes and policy. The CAMS MSPRA Policy and the PCV procedures, in addition to other relevant information is available on the PCV website under Club Info/Rules..
- If participant numbers decrease significantly in the afternoon, from 3.00pm the CoC will have the discretion to declare the continuation of timed runs on an open pit basis and maintaining a maximum track density of 26 vehicles, alternatively the CoC can declare that the event has concluded and declare an open pit where timing has ceased for the remainder of the day.
- The Porsche Club of Victoria reserves the right to take appropriate legal action, and to recover damages.

6. General

- In accordance with NCR59 of the current CAMS Manual of Motor Sport, the Promoter reserves the right to postpone, abandon or cancel the event at any time.
- Certain public, property, professional indemnity and personal accident insurance is provided by CAMS in relation to the event. Further details can be found in the CAMS Insurance Handbook, available at www.cams.com.au.
- Any holder of a CAMS 'Competition' or 'Officials' licence (or equivalent licence issued by another ASN) may be tested for the presence of drugs (or other banned substances) and subject to a penalty(ies) for a breach in accordance with the CAMS Anti-Doping Policy and/or the CAMS Illicit Drugs in Sport (Safety Testing) Policy as published on the CAMS website. Consumption of alcohol in the paddock, pits or any section of the competition venue/course under the control of the Officials is forbidden until all competition is concluded each day. Accordingly, any holder of a CAMS 'Competition' or 'Officials' licence (or equivalent licence issued by another ASN) may also be tested for the presence of alcohol by a CAMS Accredited Testing Official (CATO) in accordance with the CAMS Standard Operating Procedure for Breath Alcohol Testing. Fuel must be in accordance with Schedule G of the current CAMS Manual of Motor Sport and may not be available at the event.
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
